Adjectives can be placed after be (is, am, are, was, were) and other copular verbs like look, seem, appear, feel etc. In this case, the adjective describes the subject of the sentence.

English grammar - Adjectives | predicative position of ...

The order of adjectives in predicative position, i.e. after the verb be or link verbs such as seem or feel, is less fixed than the order before a noun. The conjunction and is generally used to link adjectives in this position, occurring before the last adjective used, e.g. The room was small and dirty. He felt cold, wet and hungry.

When there are three or more adjectives from the same adjective group, place a comma between each of the coordinate adjectives: We live in the big green, white and red house at the end of the street. My friend lost a red, black and white watch. A comma is not placed between an adjective and the noun.

Order of Adjectives - Rules & Examples | Ginger

An adjective is a word that qualifies or describes a noun or pronoun or equivalent (Gerund). For example, let I take a sentence - She is a kind lady. here 'kind' represent the quality of the lady, so here kind is used as an adjective. Similarly, take another one- Sam is an honest boy, here also 'honest' describe the quality of the boy.
