The Buddha's analysis of existence includes an understanding that karma and rebirth are part of life. According to the Buddha, the constant cycle of dying and being reborn (i.e. *saṃsāra*) according to one's karma is just *dukkha* and the ultimate spiritual goal should be liberation from this cycle.
